<p>a. Play some Maths games on Mathletics or https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/counting</p> <p>b. Practice your number formation. Make sure they are the right way round! What number will you write up to?</p> <p>c. Write and complete addition sentences within 100, adding 10 each time. E.g. $19 + 10 = 29$, $45 + 10 = 55$, $63 + 10 = 73$</p> <p>d. Write and complete subtraction sentences within 100 taking away 10 every time. E.g. $28 - 10 = 18$, $86 - 10 = 76$, $57 - 10 = 47$</p> <p>e. Write out the months of the year and days of the week. Cut them up to make a game where you can order them.</p> <p>f. Weigh different objects from your house. Toys, books, or food depending on the type of scales you have. Estimate how much something will weigh before you weigh it.</p> <p>g. Draw a castle fit for a fairy tale using 2D shapes. Use as many different shapes as you can. You could also make a model of a fairy tale castle using 3D shapes from you recycling box.</p>	<p>a. Make a movie by acting out a fairy tale with a family member and filming it.</p> <p>b. Use Microsoft Word or a similar programme to type a book review or write a story set in a magical fairy tale land.</p> <p>c. Create a PowerPoint that retells a well-known fairy tale.
